MEGIDDO, THE WAR FORTRESS

The Mount of Megiddo was not an impressive mountain. It was, however, one of the most if not the most powerful war fortresses of the ancient Middle East.

Megiddo was the fortress that dictated who was allowed to pass from North to South along the Mediterranean coastal plain in Israel. If you were the commander of an ancient army, you had to conquer Megiddo to move your army through the Carmel Mountain Pass. For this reason, Megiddo is the 2nd most attacked city in the world (#1 is Jerusalem with at least 118 conflicts). Megiddo has 34 separate conflict layers. It was totally destroyed and rebuilt many times.

The Valley of Megiddo has been the arena of many great battles throughout history. To the south lay the capital city of Israel (Jerusalem) and the ancient Egyptian Empire. To the north were the ancient empires of Assyria, Babylon, and Persia. All these empires at one time controlled Har Megiddo (the Mount of Megiddo). From ancient times to this day, this valley was used as a staging area for some of the greatest battles in history. As recently as 1799, Napoleon Bonaparte defeated the Ottomans in the Valley of Megiddo.

According to Bible prophecy, the Valley of Har Megiddo will be the scene of a great future battle. Har Megiddo (In Latin, Armageddon) will be the final battle of the age in which we are living. In this great battle, the armies of the world will gather to fight against Jesus the Christ at his second coming. The language used to describe this future battle is VERY IMPRESSIVE. Do not get me wrong, the language does NOT imply that the world's loud voice, saying to all the birds that fly in the midst of heavarmies are all that impressive. What is IMPRESSIVE about this battle is Jesus Christ returning to earth in all His Glory. This prophecy is found in Revelation chapters 16 &19.

At the end of Revelation chapter 16, John the Apostle wrote, "The sixth angel poured out his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up, so that the way of the kings from the east might be prepared... [Jesus then declared] "Behold, I am coming as a thief. Blessed is he who watches, and keeps his garments, lest he walk naked and they see his shame." And they gathered them [their armies] together to the place called in Hebrew, Armageddon [Literally: Har Megiddo/the Mount of Megiddo].

Then in Revelation chapter 19 we read about the Battle of Armageddon, "Now I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse. And He who sat on him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness He judges and makes war. His eyes were like a flame of fire, and on His head were many crowns. He had a name written that no one knew except He Himself. He was clothed with a robe dipped in blood, and His name is called The Word of God. And the armies in heaven, clothed in fine linen, white and clean, followed Him on white horses. Now out of His mouth goes a sharp sword, that with it He should strike the nations. And He Himself will rule them with a rod of iron. He Himself treads the winepress of the fierceness and wrath of Almighty God. And He has on His robe and on His thigh a name written:

KING OF KINGS AND

LORD OF LORDS."

"Then I saw an angel standing in the sun; and he cried with a

en, "Come and gather together for the supper of the great God, that you may eat the flesh of kings, the flesh of captains, the flesh of mighty men, the flesh of horses and of those who sit on them, and the flesh of all people, free and slave, both small and great."

"And I saw the beast, the kings of the earth, and their armies, gathered together to make war against Him who sat on the horse and against His army. Then the beast was captured, and with him the false prophet who worked signs in his presence, by which he deceived those who received the mark of the beast and those who worshiped his image. These two were cast alive into the lake of fire burning with brimstone. And the rest were killed with the sword which proceeded from the mouth of Him who sat on the horse. And all the birds were filled with their flesh."
